

Jazz vocalist Jenny Evans has always been a fan of classical music and as a teenager she sang Kodaly, Stravinsky and Carl Orff with the Langley Park Choir. Her great love though was the Baroque era and she sang with the London Heinrich Schutz Choir and when she studied in Munich with Munich Motettenchor.

After recording five CDs of jazz American standards, she decided in 2003 to record a CD only of compositions by European composers and also included jazz renditions of classical songs. This CD *Nuages* earned her the German Jazz Critics prize for jazz. On all her following CDs she has included further classical compositions by composers.

In her "Classic Meets Jazz"-Concerts she sings songs by the following: Léo Delibes, Claude Debussy, Henry Purcell, Anton Dvorak, John Dowland, Eric Satie, Carl Orff, Thomas Campion and Johann Sebastian Bach's well as jazz renditions of European folk music.

At her concerts Jenny Evans says she loves re-introducing jazz fans to classic evergreens and classic lovers to new renditions of old tunes.
